What is a biblical pilgrim (1 Peter 2:11-12)?

They are one who is on a journey through a foreign land headed to their home in heaven. A holy people destined for a holy land.

What is biblical hope (Hebrews 6:11)?

A confident expectation in the promises of God concerning things He said will come.

How can sinners like us have confidence in a holy God to work for us and secure a bright future (Romans 8:1-4)?

The grace of God is the foundation of our hope (2 Thes. 2:16); the outlet of that grace is the gospel (Col. 1:23). Today's text brings us to the effects of the gospel on the believer. Those who are in Christ do not face the condemnation of God.

From what condemnation have we escaped (vs. 1)?

How does moving from one law to another law give us freedom (vs. 2)?

How can the sin that condemned us be condemned (vs. 3)?

How are the righteous requirements fulfilled in us (vs. 4)?
