| 2. Episkopos - Overseer: 1 Tim. 3:1-2   |
| 3. Poimen - Shepherd (Pastor): 1 Peter 5:2                                    |
| They are devoted to preaching, prayer, and ministry of the word. (Acts 6:1-4) |
| Equip the saints. (Eph. 4:11-14)  |
| Shepherd the flock. (1 Peter 5:1-3, John 21:16, Acts 20:28-29)                |

Works with a team of other qualified overseers (James 5:14, Acts 14:23)

## How does someone become an overseer (vs. 1-7)?

They must first have a God-given call and desire (vs. 1).

Then the church evaluates them in two main areas (vs. 2-7, Titus 1:6-9, 1 Peter 5:1-3)

- 12. Not a new covert
- 13. Thought well of by outsiders
